### Sample Schedule

**2pm** arrival & set up

**2:30pm** play as guests arrive

**3:00pm** Ceremony starts

Play for bridal party entrance  
(Recommended to choose 1 song, or 2, depending on the length of the aisle and how many are walking in the processional.)

During the ceremony: We often play for the signing of the register, but can

also play a special request, hymns, or sing-along songs.

**3:30-3:45pm** End of ceremony, play music for couple's exit

Move to cocktail our area and begin to play for guests, a mixture of modern pop and older classics.

\*For ceremony + 1 hour we would finish by 5pm, ceremony plus 2 hours, by 6pm.\*

We are happy to do a personalized quote, often the guest arrival time is 1 hour before the ceremony (and not 30 minutes). We can play through until dinner or during dinner as well.
